One of the easiest ways to pay next to cash when you see Jim is to use Bill Pay from your banking institution. Please see Jim's section of the Newsletter for the ways to pay. The dinner is scheduled for 1:30pm Saturday, 16 September. The Bavarian Inn Restaurant is across the street from Zehnder's and at the road that goes through the Covered Bridge. Betty Ward has secured some

parking spaces at the South end of the parking lot again this year. For those interested in riding up to Frankenmuth, some of us will be meeting at Ted's Coney Island in Richmond, Mi. located at the intersection where M-19 turns left off of North bound Gratiot. Plan on side stands up at 9:30 am. So if you want breakfast, get there early. The route will be back roads through the thumb up through Vassar and over to Frankenmuth. No one has notified me of any other starting location, so if you are planning on a different route and want some company, please email the group. This always one of our best and most fun events, and I am really looking forward to this ride.

I will not be here for the September meeting, we still do not have a location for the meeting as yet. The lunch/dinner ride for this month is the Zukey Lake Tavern as it was switched from last month. These types of rides take a lot of preparation because even though it is generally one of your favorite routes, you have to drive the route 3 to 5 times looking for questions and making sure your turn by turn directions are correct, then you have ride the route another 2 to 3 times to verify that you can observe everything and have the places to stop on a bike to write down the answers and read the next few questions. Quite involved but they are fun to create and to participate.
