## New member – Larry Edmonds

#### Hello from Sarnia, Ontario.

Like so many people I got my motorcycle licence when I was in high school. That was 1969. I got involved with lots of different hobbies and past times after high school and motorcycles were not a priority. Fast forward to the year 2000 and I decided to buy a vintage bike and get back into the sport. It started with a 1972 Triumph Bonneville but it didn't stop there. Since then I have owned Honda, Suzuki, Kawasaki, Yamaha and Bultaco bikes and I still have a Dnepr sidecar rig.

In 2002 I wrote off my 1981 Honda CB900F

by using it to cave in the front fender of a car that pulled out in front of me and that was when I got my first BMW. It was a 1987 K100LT. In November of 2005 I traded it in on a 1998 K1200RS.

In 2006 my wife, Kathy, and I rode our bikes to our first BMWMOA rally in Vermont. We attended seminars, took the experienced rider training and met people who we still count as friends.

I replaced the differential but started to think it was time to buy a bike that was made in this century. So in late August I purchased a low mileage 2002 R1150RT which is working out great.
