Prez Sez



I would like to share several subjects with the club members this month!

First I had a great time riding in Morehead KY in July, great roads but experienced a lot of debris remaining on the roads including standing water, mud, trees and branches and even entire homes and cars that were washed onto parts of the road. Other areas witnessed entire sections of roadway that were collapsed or gaping holes large enough to swallow trucks. The devastation we witnessed from floods that swept that part of the country was just unbelievable!

Still we had a great time and some of the best riding that I have ever experienced.

Twice in the last month I have personally witnessed the results of accidents as a result of riders passing out because of dehydration!

One was a guy who worked all day doing physical labor with a landscaping company, came home took a shower and proceeded to unload his bike that a friend returned after performing some engine work. While his son watched, the 54 year old father backed it off the trailer and rode it down the block with no helmet and no protective gear. Moving no more than 10mph at the time, he passed out and went down resulting in damage to his face, hands, arms and shoulders. He spent 3 weeks in the hospital and another 3 weeks at home in bed and when I saw him he still looked pretty bad. In the ER they instantly knew from his blood work that he was dangerously dehydrated at the time. Prior to this incident he had been riding motorcycles for more than 40 years without a serious accident.

The second situation was a rider that was sitting on a highway trapped in a construction area during 90 degree temperatures who did not feel good so he took off his helmet and put it on one of his mirrors until he could get off the road. Once he started moving while not wearing the helmet he began to feel a little better so he decided to continue on the highway for another 3 miles to a posted rest stop. Half way there he began to feel faint and managed to get off the road before passing out at which point his 800 pound bike fell on him.

As a rule of thumb:

- 1. Riders may need to drink (Their Weight in Pounds /2) = Oz of water per day. This means that the average 200 lb guy needs at least 100oz of water.
- 2. The effects of dehydration are cumulative throughout the day and may have nothing to do with how you feel at any given moment. Even after stopping and having a drink you could suffer the effects of dehydration. You must drink throughout the day even if you are not thirsty to protect yourself.
- 3. If you are dehydrated and lucky enough to get a warning sign PAY ATTENTION to your body and immediately get yourself into a safe environment, you may not make the remaining 3 miles either.

Enjoy the summer, protect yourself, ride safe and have some fun!

Editor's Corner



Another dealership has a T-shirt that I just had to buy some time back: "How many motorcycles does one person need? JUST ONE MORE!". That's *so* me. Well, I have gone to, if not the Dark Side, at least, the Noisy Side. I bought a 1990 Harley Davidson Tour Glide.

I've been getting the itch for another motorcycle for a while now. I love my K1200LT, it's got to be one of the finest motorcycles made. However, I'd like to have a smaller bike for commuting to and from work. The LT is not only big, but it is top-heavy; it isn't a lot of fun to get stuck in traffic jams with...and stop-andgo traffic is a part of my daily commute.

I've also got my '85 K100, but there's only one thing that makes a K100 feel "small", and that's an LT. It's still top-heavy and still not much fun to creep through traffic with. BMWs are made to do the Autobahn, not stop-and-go traffic. And while my Buell Blast is light, it's tiny and I look like a clown riding it.

A few weeks ago, I found out about a 1990 HD Street Glide for a great price. And, I got to admit, I've always loved the look of the Harley machines. And, this was an FLT (frame mounted faring, dual front headlights), which I've always preferred over the more common FLH (front suspension mounted fairings, one or three headlights). And it turned out, this thing had the factory exhaust on it, which is far less obnoxious than most HDs on the road, which pretty much sealed the deal.

The first day I drove it to work, one of my coworkers said, "Hey, you aren't wearing leather. You got a Harley, aren't you supposed to wear leather?". I told him, as I was wearing my mesh textile jacket, "I'm cross dressing!"

It is interesting to compare my 1985 K100RT, my 1990 Harley FLT and my 2002 K1200LT. No question in my mind, the K engine beats the Harley V-twin in just about everything, even in only its second year of production on the K100. The K100RT is much "Sportier" than the Harley, but the HD is clearly designed for comfort – nicer seats, stereo, and smoother at 70MPH (the K100 has a horrible chassis buzz at about 70MPH – solved by going faster!). The much newer K1200LT, on the other hand, has the "luxury" thing down pat, it's only real issues are the height and center of gravity.

If I had to chose ONE motorcycle, it would be the LT, no question. The cool thing is, I don't have to chose. The low center of gravity of the HD makes it a lot easier to handle in stop-and-go traffic, and if she chooses to do so, Paula could drive the Harley. But when we ride together, the LT is going to be the choice.

For me, biking is about fun. There's no rule about there being one kind of fun. The BMW and the Harley are both fun...different kinds of fun, but both fun to me. Heck, I have motorized-vehicle fun with four-wheeled vehicles, too. I spend a lot of my life in vehicles going from place to place; I can't comprehend wasting it driving a dull vehicle.

But, I've found the group I like to ride and hang out with...the Motor City Beemers.

Brian Boers (our newest member), Jay Mick and I started 'heading west' on Saturday morning, July 18th. After 3766 miles we got back home Monday and Tuesday 7/27 & 28. Brian had to be to work Tuesday morning while Jay and I spent Monday night in Frankfort to pick up more parts for his business.

We saw Mike Madley, Pat & Lynn Kelley and heard that Dick & Sharon Hautau also made it to the MOA, but we didn't see them stop by Jay's booth.

We arrived a day early to go whitewater rafting. The water was low so it wasn't very exciting, but I did get thrown from my seat to the bottom of the raft one time. Then we made the 'required' Beartooth Pass run – getting back to our motel in Billings very late that night.

The newest model of Mick-O-Pegs (for the 2014-15 R1200RT) was a hit! Jay sold out of his first production run which he received the day before we left home. Thanks again to George Domany for lending his RT for prototype work. The new model is named after George – Model TG. The last leg was "S" for the Honda ST1300, so this NEW leg is "T", and the Bracket that mounts to the two studs holding the exhaust pipes is our "G" bracket (George).

This was my first real trip using GPS (Go Past Street)... and it was a learning experience. I didn't take my maps, but I think I will always want to take them in the future so I can see the bigger picture. The GPS would tell me to go one way and I knew there was a more desirable way – from previous experiences. At one place in the UP, the GPS wanted me to take US41 down to US2 once US28 split from US41, but I wanted to take MI94 back to US28 again. After two attempts to have me make turns on the next two streets, it told me to make a U-Turn when possible. Once it accepted my 'better' direction, it had my ETA decreased by 13 min from when I was on US41 before turning onto MI94. If you have traveled US28 and US2 to/from the west, you know that US28 is shorter, but you may be interested in checking out MI94 between US41 and US28. MI94 avoids some city driving (if there is such a thing in the UP).

Can't tell you much about the MOA 'cause Jay was a slave driver keeping Brian and me busy in the booth helping riders get more comfortable for their trip back home.
