Grilling and Chillin' Your Meat

This month once again we are having our annual club picnic and steak fry. I love grilling, which should never be confused with BBQ. Grilling is a quick searing process that we use up north here for our meats. Steaks, chops, chicken, hot dogs, hamburgers and fresh vegetables are just a few of the items we can grill. BBQ is a low heat, long time process with lots of spice rubs and sauces that are famous in the south, southeast and southwest. These meats are normally tougher cuts and or muscle cuts of meat. Sausage is also great smoked or in BBQ.

Grilling is done over medium to high heat and usually with a medium to high end cut of meat. Both methods are an art and take attention to details. Grilling can take as little as 10-20 minutes where BBQ can take 16-20 hours depending on the cut and texture desired. There is one common denominator between both these styles and that is both styles require the meat to "rest". Resting your meat means to allow the juices to return to the center of the meat so it stays juicy and tender. I usually let my steaks rest 15-20 minutes before cutting into them. And don't worry, your steak or whatever type of meat you have will not get COLD, trust me! I have been doing this for over 30 years and it only gets better. I rest my Thanksgiving turkey, my Christmas prime rib and my Easter leg of lamb which usually get roasted in the oven, but the same rule applies.

I like to grill, our house is the family party house. We have an in ground pool, seating capacity for at least 24 on the deck and around the pool. We have family and friends over every weekend from Memorial Day to well after a Labor Day. When we have that many folks over I am doing a lot of grilling. I have a secret for grilling for that many at a time. Let's face it, I don't want to be stuck behind a hot grill on a party day with guests all about and me busier than a one armed paper hanger in a chicken coop. So I start grilling a couple hours before our guests are to arrive. My secret is my trusty coolers. I line them with aluminum foil and as my meat gets close to done on the grill I place the meat into the cooler, stacking it as I go. Once the meat is in the cooler, the lid goes on and we let it rest and steam itself to perfection. The contents will stay table hot for at least an hour. In the meantime I am mingling with our guests, swimming or enjoying an adult beverage or two. Try it, you'll like it! Grilling doesn't take a lot of seasoning, kosher salt, fresh ground pepper, garlic butter and any store bought grilling spice. BBQ on the other hand can take 15-25 seasonings all combined together and rubbed copiously all over your piece of meat.

I said all that to say this, when you take your piece of meat off the grill at the picnic in June, give it at least 15 minutes before you cut into it. I want you to enjoy it to the fullest.

Maybe George Domany can write a piece on BBQ and smoking meat for next month's newsletter. He and Laurie are quite proficient in the art of smoking and real BBQ.

I hope this helps and feel free to ask questions or share your grilling secrets on the 10th at our annual steak fry and picnic around the grill.

On the calendar in August is a ride to St. Ignace that Paula and I are organizing. Exact details are still up in the air a bit – depending on who is going, their interests, the weather, and other attendees suggestions – but it will probably be something like leaving late morning/early afternoon Friday (or maybe Thursday evening and stop at West Branch?), heading north up I-75, stop a few times on the way, and cross the Mackinac Bridge Friday evening. On our planned weekend, there's a "Motorcycles on the Mac" ride on Saturday morning, crossing back from St. Ignace to Mackinaw City and then back to St. Ignace, maybe some people will wish to participate... Us? We'll probably still be asleep, as that starts at 7:00am, and I only recognize one 7:00 in a day...and that "AM" one is NOT IT!

Targets for us to hit Saturday include the Soo Locks in Sault Ste. Marie to see some freighters up close, Tahquamenon Falls, and perhaps a sunset on Lake Michigan, then head back on Sunday, stopping in Frankenmuth, where Paula will lighten my wallet at the Little White House on Main Street and probably Tony's I-75. The ride between St. Ignace and Tahquamenon Falls is a lot of fun. I suspect the plans will stay relatively "lose" – if a rainy weekend is forecast, we may "cage" it instead.

Our favorite motel in St. Ignace (Quality Inn, Lakefront) is already over 50% booked for that weekend, so do not join us without making reservations, and make them soon! Yes, for those of us that actually have to work for a living, this will involve getting a Friday off.

The Driftwood is relatively cheap (I know that is important to a lot of you!), but it's further away from our favorite restaurants and a bit more spartan than our preference, though the Driftwood restaurant itself is very good. If you stay at the Driftwood, you will NOT be the only bikers there, it seems to be a favorite for bikers and snowmobilers. There is probably also camping, which we know nothing about, so you are on your own there.

Note that this trip involves crossing the Mackinac Bridge, which some consider quite an adventure in and of itself. If you haven't done this, you have two choices: either the center lane, which is further from the guard rails, BUT is steel grating, and many bikes get a little squirrely on that...or the outer lane, which gives you a great view of the water...waaaay below (I'm not helping, am I?). Realistically, there is maintenance taking place almost all summer on the Big Mac, so you may not have any choice in lane...and in fact, you will possibly end up driving in both. The best advice I heard for driving on grating is "The bike wants to do the right thing", don't worry about a little wiggle, just keep pointing it forward, it will get you through. And remember: no motorcycle has ever gone off the Mackinac Bridge. You are unlikely to be the first (still not helping?). Oh, and sometimes there are wicked crosswinds.

The people that run the bridge have some ability to help people terrified of big bridges across, but whether this applies to your issues or motorcycles is up to you to find out.

Meal plans include Jose's Cantina, a very fun Mexican place, for at least one dinner, and if it isn't too crowded, Java Joe's for breakfast. Both are easy walks from any of the listed motels except for Driftwood.

Hope you can join us, we really enjoy hangin' with the 'Beemers!

MOTOR CITY BEEMERS NAME TAGS

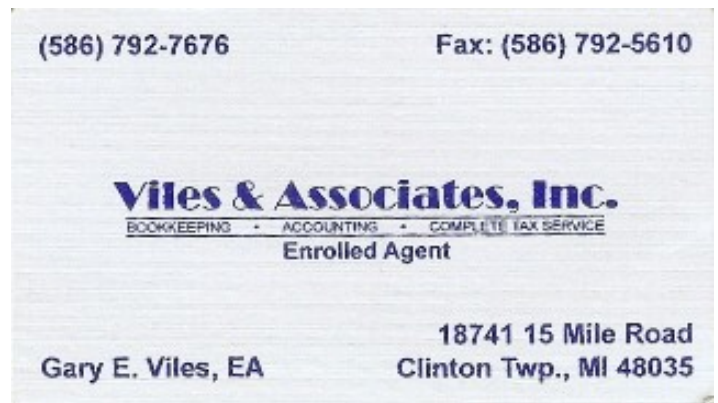
