

Prez Sez Nick Holland

#### Hello, MCBeemers!

Business: Our November meeting will be an important one. We will be setting the dues for our next year, taking effect in January. As you probably remember, earlier this year we voted to start a plan of running down the treasury in preparation for dissolution of the formal club under the existing bylaws. Our plan, if the members agree, is to drop our dues to zero for 2023, but to continue to fund events like the Winter Banquet, Frankenmuth and the picnic until



the treasury is mostly exhausted, then formally dissolve the formal club (or until people step up to run the club under its existing bylaws). As I've said before, and I still believe, I think this can be a good thing for our club. The existing bylaws exist primarily because we are club that handles other people's money. If we drop that requirement, we can become more responsive to what current and active membership wants out of the club. BMW Detroit is selling a LOT of motorcycles, so there's a lot of potential new blood and new ideas that are available to lead the club in new directions. If those directions suggest a new bylawed club, great, if it is just a bunch of people that get together periodically and eat and ride, that's fine too.

Our last meeting was our annual picnic. It was a bit cool (or cold, or just right, depending on who you talk to -I was very much towards the "just right", I think Josh was much more towards "cold"). The food was fantastic, I think the general response was "even better than last year" -S mokey Jim's BBW on Huron Rd. in Marysville. I suspect we'll be going there ourselves in the future.

As a general rule, about a day after the newsletter goes out, I think of all the things I meant to put in the newsletter that month. That was true both when I was the person putting it together and now that I'm president. Back in September, we were notified a bit late about "Adventure Rider" and author Sam Manicom coming to our dealership to discuss his adventures in riding in various exotic places around the world, meeting great people, eating "interesting" food and catching exotic diseases. It was a fascinating talk, in this case, mostly about his trip through Africa, one of his first adventure rides. I'm probably not the right person to be writing about this – mostly, I love hearing other people's travel adventure stories, as it eliminates my interest in travel. Honestly, I don't like crossing the border to Canada, so keep that in mind when reading my comments. A few of his bits of wisdom that I'm remembering:

- The fruits and vegetables throughout Africa were, he said, amazing. Fresh and exotic beyond belief.

- Be prepared (mentally, as there's probably nothing you can do about it otherwise) to interact with local law enforcement. It won't be fun.

#### HOW TO PAY:

"Bill Pay". Use your Bank/CU 'Bill Pay' option. Most banks/CUs charge no fee – not even postage. Just, have them send payment(s) to Jim Mick, 56750 FAIRCHILD RD, MACOMB, MI 48042. Once you input any payee name and address into their Bill Pay system, subsequent payments only require you to input the amount (and date). Please indicate in the memo for what you are paying.
